The University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA) has named U.S. Air Force (USAF) Brigadier General (Ret.) Guy M. Walsh as the founding executive director of its National Security Collaboration Center (NSCC).

The NSCC, an initiative in UTSA's Downtown Campus expansion, will advance research, education and workforce development in cybersecurity, data analytics and cloud computing while anchoring the creation of an emerging high-tech corridor to support San Antonio's future.

25 Chapters were represented, some by more than one person.

Infrastructure Week. The Chapel is finally getting its facelift. The renovated and improved Planetarium and STEM Center has been opened. And the work on the North Gate mixed use area is finally underway.

The Endowment. Even though only 12% of grads give, an amazing amount of good is being done to improve and support Academy operations. In the past 12 years, about 191M has been raised by the Endowment. Some of the funded elements include the Institute for Future Conflict and the Center for Cyber Innovation.
